

Domestic Revenue Mobilisation at the heart of Sustainable Development: the Seville Declaration

Background

As the global community convenes at the FFD4 to address the urgent need to step up financing for the 2030 Agenda, strengthening domestic revenue mobilisation (DRM) is ever more crucial for achieving sustainable development. Effective and progressive fiscal systems play a pivotal role in expanding fiscal space, fostering investment and economic growth, addressing inequalities, supporting climate change adaptation and mitigation efforts, and fortifying the social contract between governments and their citizens.

Since its establishment in 2015, the Addis Tax Initiative (ATI) has driven political momentum for DRM, advancing the implementation of the Addis Ababa Action Agenda, and fostering cooperation among development partners, partner countries and supporting organisations to strengthen tax systems. In a renewed pledge to scaling up DRM efforts, ATI members are proposing the introduction of the **"Seville Declaration on Domestic Revenue Mobilisation"** – a new initiative aimed at mobilising the international community around an ambitious agenda to strengthen tax systems in support of the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). The Declaration outlines new actions to advance fair and effective DRM, policy coherence, and reinforce the social contract through collaborative partnerships and knowledge-building.

To mark this milestone, the ATI is convening a high-level event to introduce the Seville Declaration, discuss its key messages and actions proposed, and encourage its endorsement by various countries and stakeholders, including ATI and non-ATI members. The event will bring together policymakers, representatives of international organisations, civil society, and all participants of the FFD4 to engage in discussions on collective actions to promote DRM in partner countries.
